- Identify the advantages, limitations, and handling characteristics of commonly used regenerative materials.
- Apply evidence-based decision-making to select appropriate biomaterials for different clinical scenarios in implant therapy.
- Discuss novel techniques and future trends in biomaterial development.
- Integrate updated scientific knowledge into daily clinical protocols to improve patient outcomes and treatment predictability.
